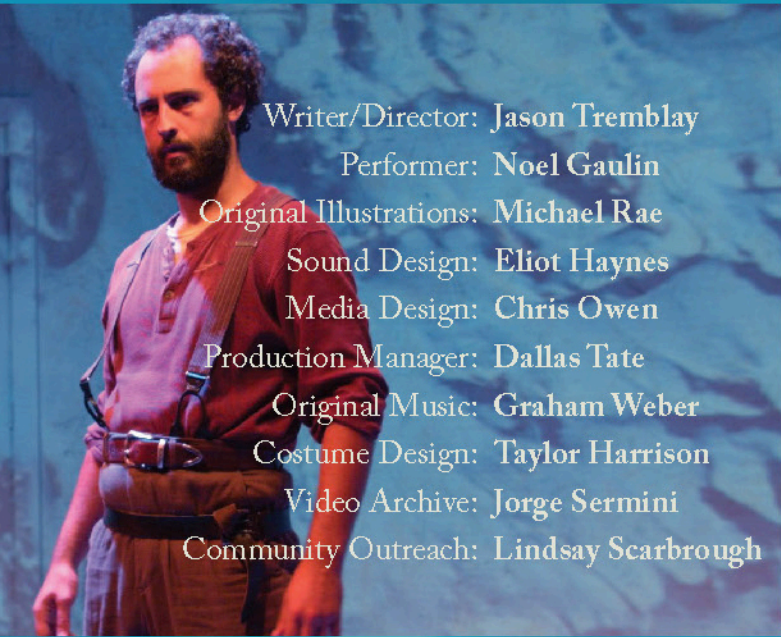

WHO IS JACK LONDON?

Jack London, whose life symbolized the power of will, was the most successful writer in America in the early 20th Century. His vigorous stories of men and animals against the environment, and survival against hardships were drawn mainly from his own experience. London passed his childhood in poverty in the Oakland slums. At the age of 17, he ventured to sea. The turning point of his life was a thirty-day imprisonment that was so degrading it made him decide to turn to education and pursue a career in writing. His years in the Klondike searching for gold left their mark in his best short stories; among them, *The Call of the Wild*, and *White Fang*. His work embraced the concepts of unconfined individualism and Darwinism in its exploration of the laws of nature.

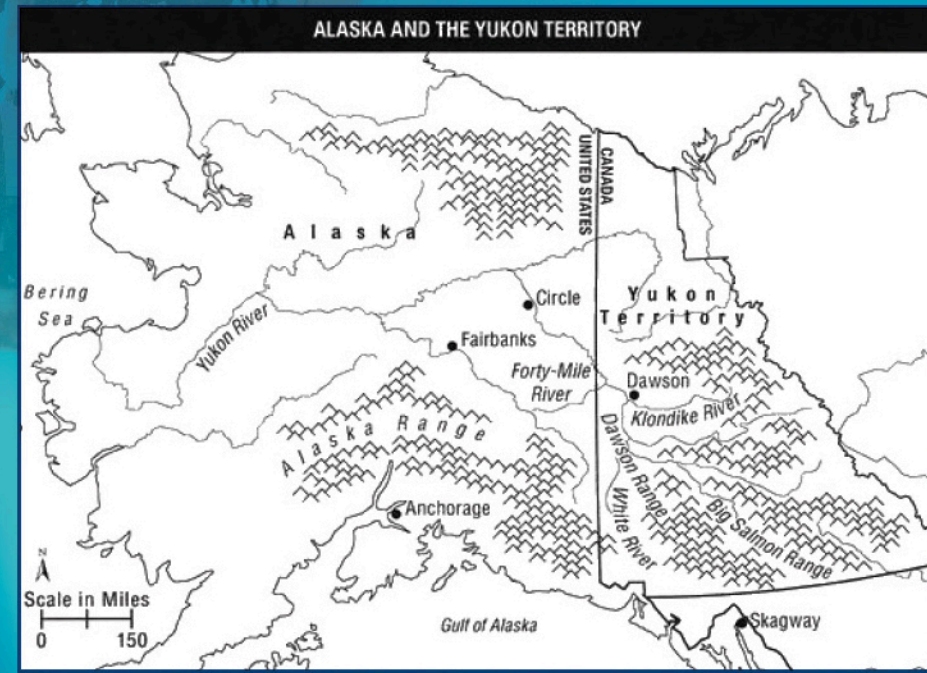

CHARLES DARWIN & BUCK



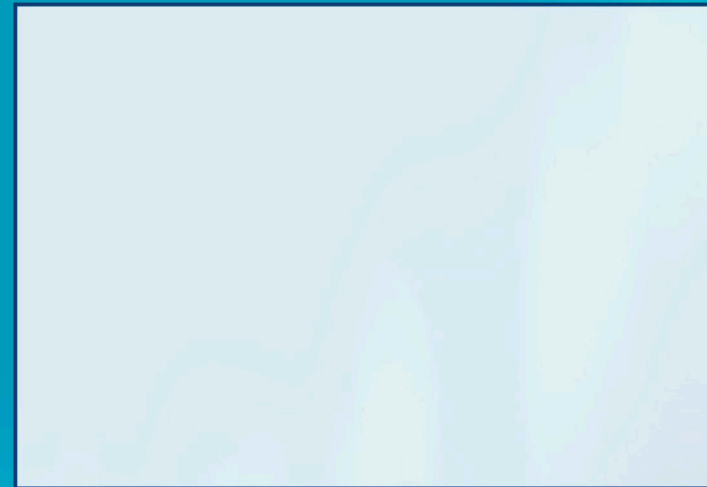
In 1859, the scientist Charles Darwin published a book called *The Origin of Species*. This book provided the world with evidence of evolution. Evolution is the process by which different kinds of living organisms are thought to have developed and diversified from earlier forms during the history of the earth.

A big part of an animal's evolution is its ability to adapt to new surroundings and situations. Buck must adapt to many new situations in *Call of the Wild*. **Fill in the chart below to further explore how Buck is able to adapt and succeed in a new environment.**

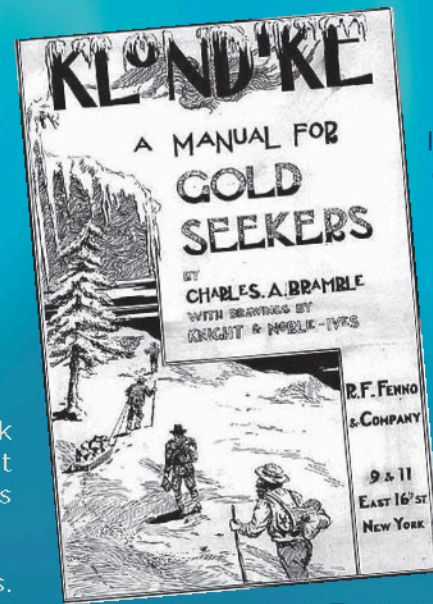

THE GOLDEN CATALYST



In 1848, a man named James Marshall discovered gold in California. This started a major trend in the United States, thousands of people from all over began migrating to the West coast in search of the precious metal and the wealth that accompanied it. In the late 1800's people moved their golden search northward to Alaska and a north-western region on Canada known as the Klondike. This is where our story, *Call of the Wild*, takes place. A select few found enough gold to secure the wealth they sought after. For most, however, these journeys were fruitless.

For many Americans, traveling to the Klondike in search of gold was the key to the American Dream.

MUSH!

For centuries, sled dogs were the best form of transportation available in Alaska. Buck and his various masters travelled the Yukon by sled. **Can you label the image below with these vocabulary terms?**

- MUSHER
- WHEEL DOGS
- TEAM DOGS
- SWING DOGS
- THE SLED
- LEAD DOGS

Can be any age, sex or race. They relay commands to the team and sometimes run behind the sled to speed it along.

They provide the "horsepower" of the team and help turn the sled.

They help set the pace and turn the sled around corners.



Older versions are made out of wood, but modern ones are built of space-age materials such as Kevlar and Titanium.

They are placed directly ahead of the sled and tend to be the strongest dogs on the team.

They are the head of the team. They respond to the musher's commands, find-and-follow the trails, and set the pace of the team.

PACK YOUR PACK



While packing for a Klondike excursion, one had to ensure that they had plenty of clothing, food, and supplies. They also had to be mindful of how much weight they were carrying so that they weren't slowing or exhausting their sled dogs. What would you pack if you were to venture onto the Yukon Trail in search of gold?

COLD WEATHER CONVERSIONS

Celsius to Fahrenheit formula

$$F = C \cdot \frac{9}{5} + 32$$

Fahrenheit to Celsius formula

$$C = (F - 32) \cdot \frac{5}{9}$$

- As we know, the Yukon region is full of snow and harsh weather conditions in the winter. This part of the world has a subarctic climate. During the coldest seasons, temperatures can get down to -50 degrees Celsius.
- In the summer, surprisingly, the Yukon gets pretty warm with high temperatures averaging 77 degrees Fahrenheit.

Convert -50° Celsius to Fahrenheit: _____

Convert 77° Fahrenheit to Celsius: _____
